## PROBLEM

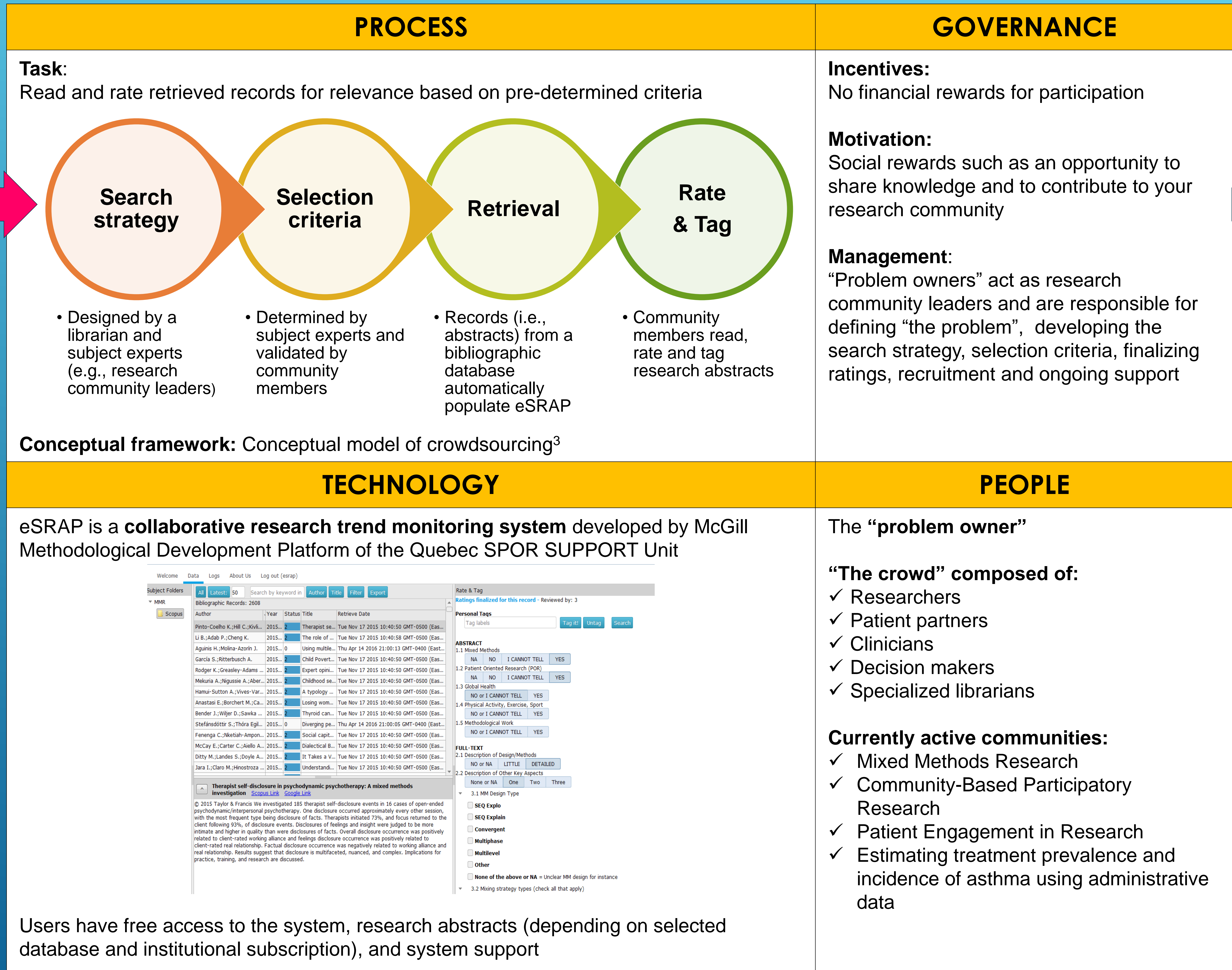
Keeping up with scientific publications is challenging due to information overload, time constraints and insufficient evaluation skills.<sup>1-2</sup>
